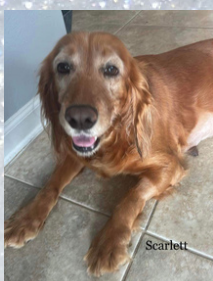

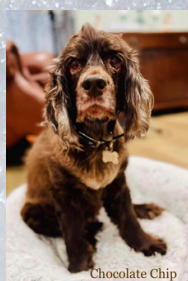

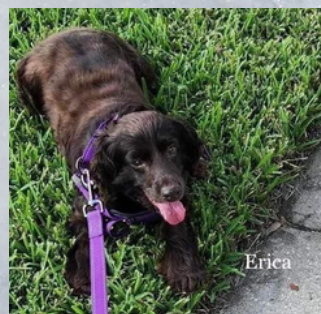

March is National Pet Poison Prevention Month. It's a great time to learn about the dangers of accidental pet poisonings and how to prevent them.

*Do you know what the Number One dog poison is? It's over-the-counter medications such as Tylenol, Advil, Aleve as well as herbal and nutraceutical products. Foods with Xylitol, also known as Birch sugar (found in peanut butter and gum), grapes, raisins, onions, garlic, protein bars and of course chocolate. Dogs really like chocolate and may consume enough to cause serious issues. Keep that Easter candy put away!*

## Pet Poison Awareness Cont.

What are the symptoms of poisons caused by swallowing? Symptoms include vomiting, diarrhea, agitation and heart issues. If toxins have been inhaled, your dog may have breathing difficulties or loss of consciousness. Symptoms from skin contact include irritation and pain.

Should you suspect your pet of being poisoned, keep them calm and contact a veterinary professional immediately. If you cannot reach a veterinary professional, you can call the ASPCA 24/7 Poison Control Hotline at **888-426-4435** or the Pet Poison Helpline at **855-764-7661**. Fees may apply for the services, but are well worth it.

## YMMIES FOR THE TUMMIES

### Fruit Ice Cream

- 1 Yogurt (Lactose-free or veggie)
- 1 Banana
- 1/4 Cup Strawberries
- 1/4 Cup Blueberries

- Blend all ingredients in a blender
- Gently fill a silicone tray with mixture
- Place tray in freezer for 2-3 hours
- Before giving them to your dog, keep them for a few minutes out of the freezer so they get the best flavor and texture.
